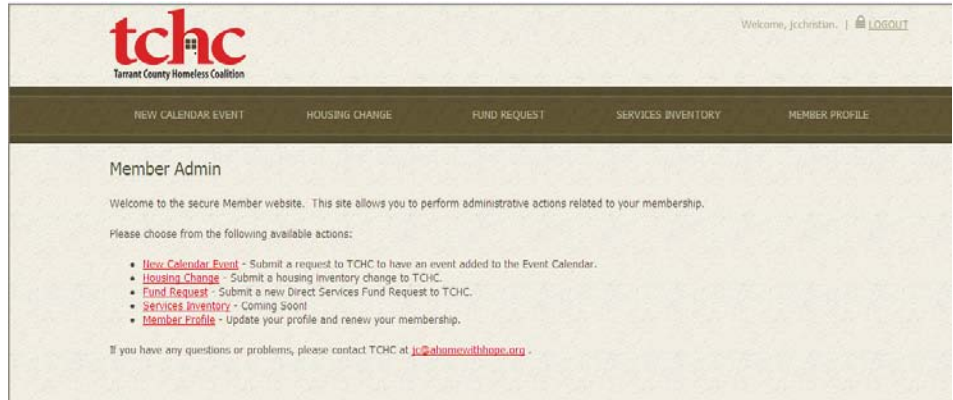


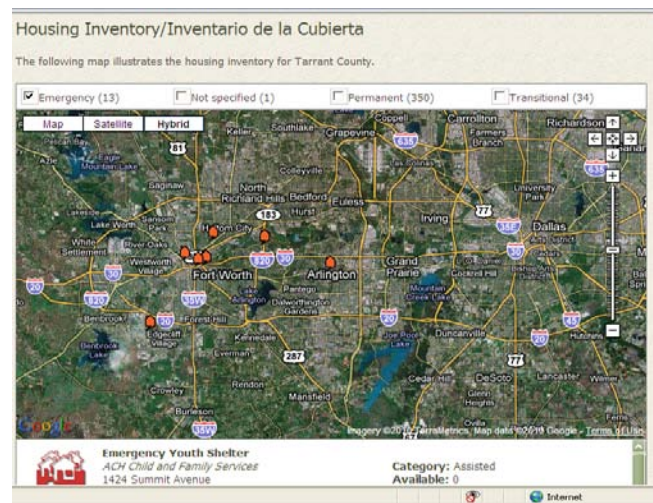
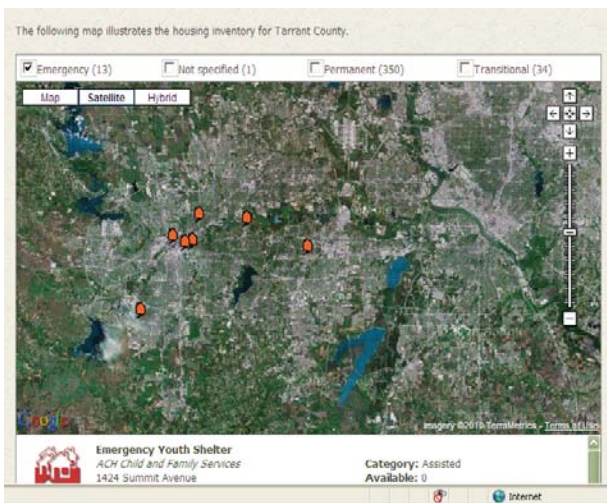
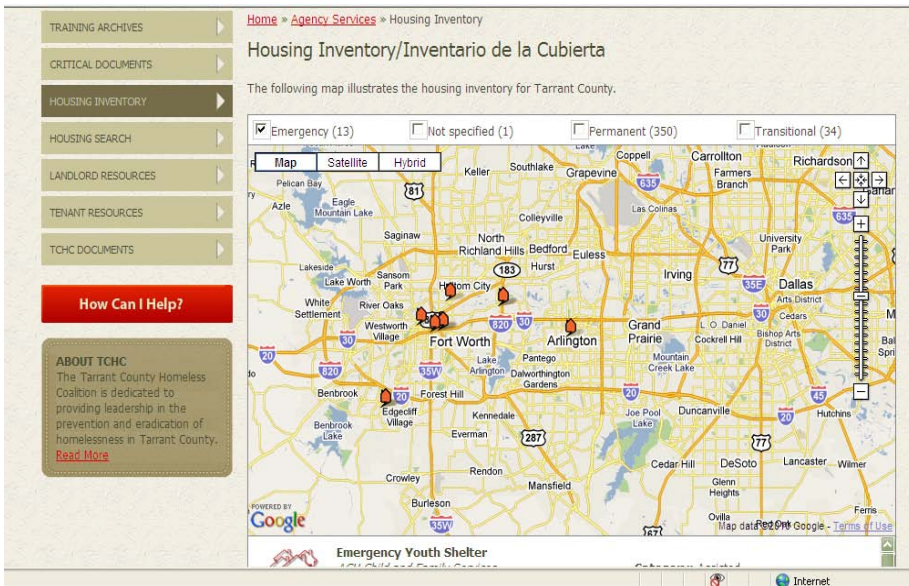
How to Use the Housing Inventory Database: Look at the Inventory

Step One: On the TCHC website, click on “Member Login” and use your unique username and password. If you do not have one, email J.C. Christian at jc@ahomewithhope.org. You should come a page that looks like this:



Step Two: Go back to the home page and click on “Agency Services.” Then on the left navigation bar, select Housing Inventory. You should come to a page that looks like the left.

Choose either Emergency, Permanent, or Transitional. You can only choose one selection at a time. You can view three different maps: the Google road map shown to the left, the satellite map (bottom left), or the hybrid map (below).

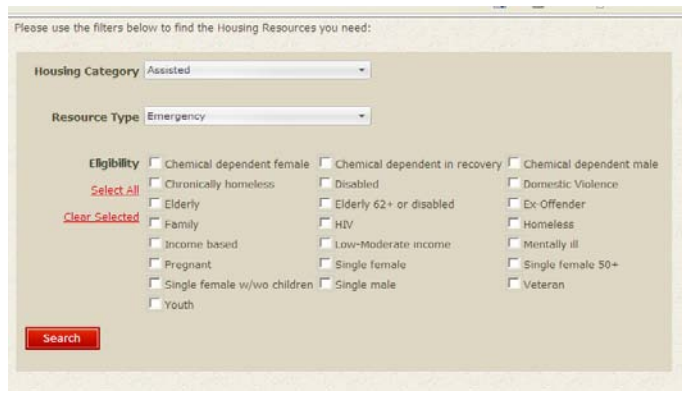
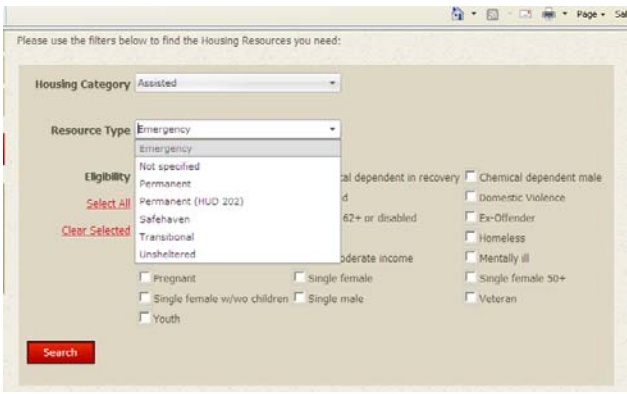
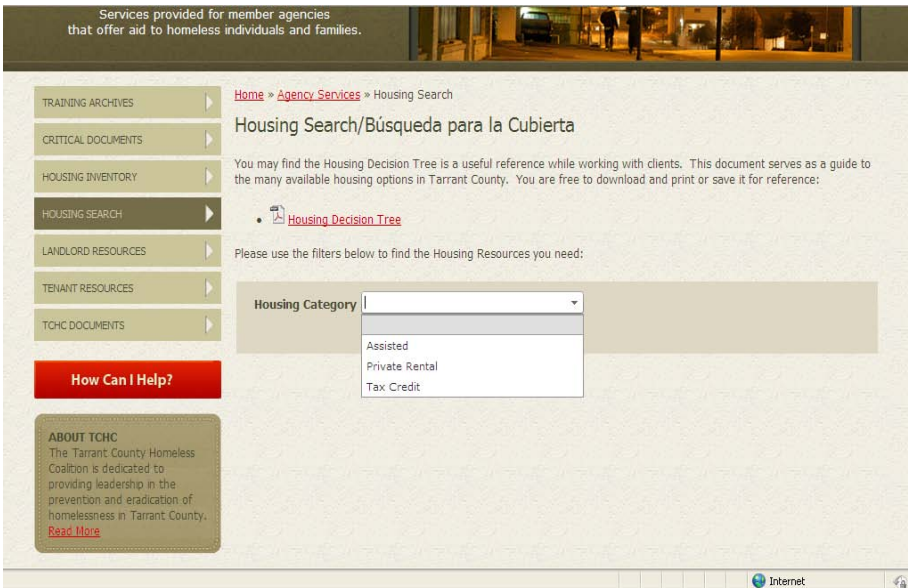


The maps show red houses. These indicate the locations of your housing selections. You can click on the red houses to reveal the locations and detailed information about the housing program and their current availability.

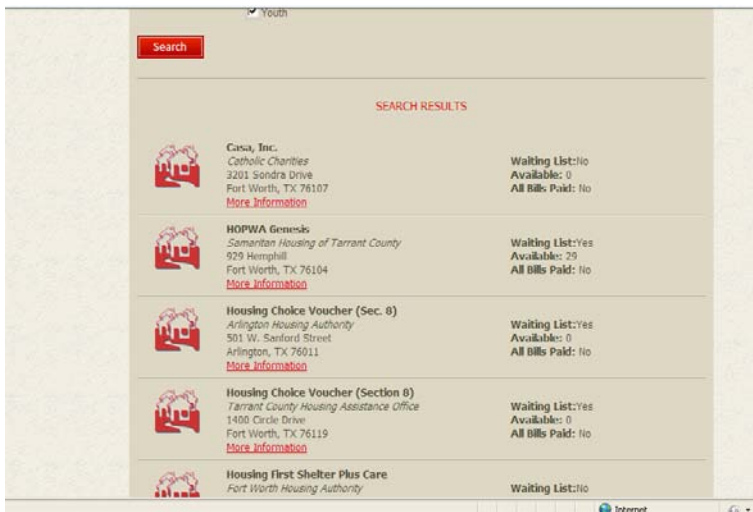
How to Use the Housing Inventory Database: Performing A Housing Search

Step One: Go back to the home page and click on “Agency Services.” Then on the left navigation bar, select “Housing Search.” You should come to a page that looks like the left.

Click on the “Housing Category” tab and choose either Assisted, Private Rental, or Tax Credit. You can only choose one selection at a time.



Assisted: When you click on the “Assisted” tab, you come to a page that looks like above. Select which resource type (emergency, transitional, permanent, etc.) and the different types of eligibility listed (you can even select all if you are not sure). Once you have made your selection, click the red “Search” button on the bottom left. Your result will appear below the categories, similar to this:

Private Rental & Tax Credit: When you click on the “Private Rental or Tax Credit “ tab, you come to a page that looks like the one above. Select whether you want all bills paid or not and which amenities you prefer (1 bedroom, 2 bedrooms, etc.). In addition, you can select the eligibility of the rental or whether it is disabled, elderly, homeless, income based, low/moderate income, or all of the above. Once you have made your selection, click the red “Search” button on the bottom left. Your result will appear below the categories, similar to this:

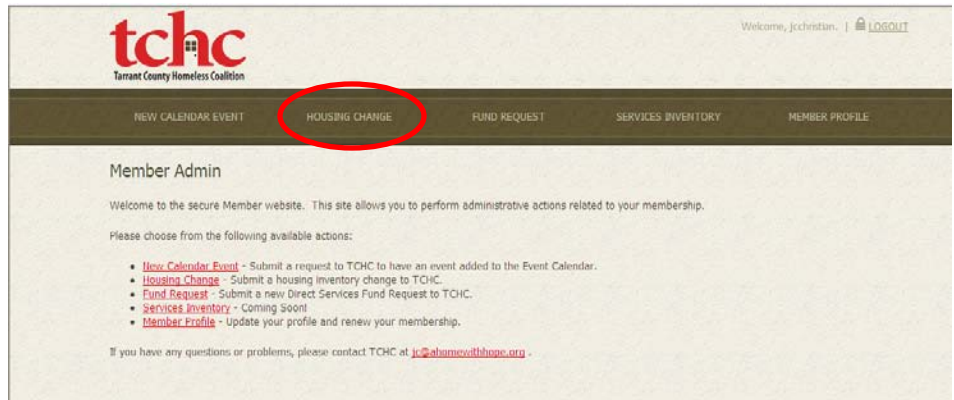

How to Use the Housing Inventory Database: Submitting A Housing Change

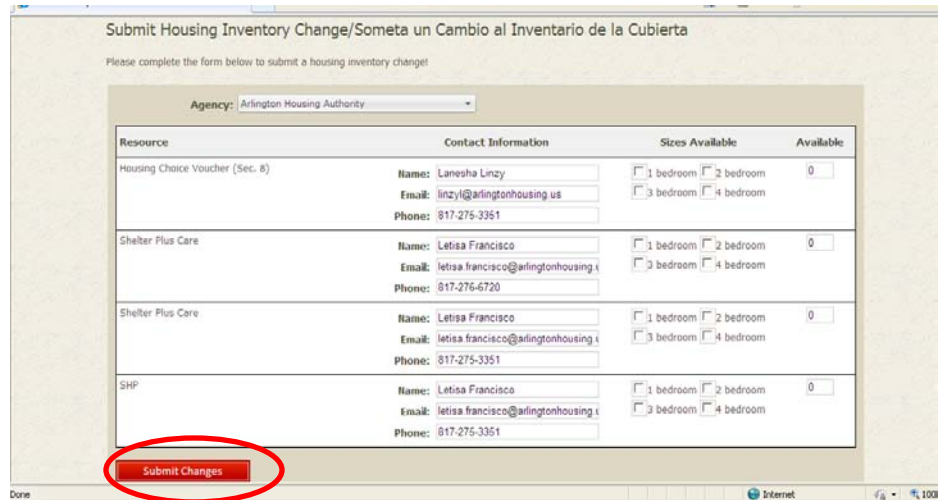
Step One: On the TCHC website, click on “Member Login” and use your unique username and password. If you do not have one, email J.C. Christian at jc@ahomewithhope.org. You should come to a page that looks like this:



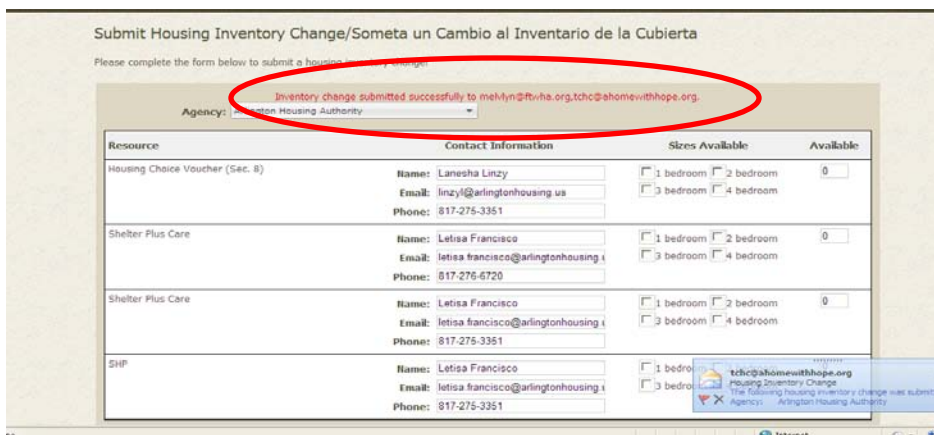
Step Two: Click on the “Housing Change” tab on the member toolbar circled above. You should come to a page that looks like the one to the left.



Step Three: Select your agency from the list. You should come to a page that looks like this:



Step Four: Update your agency’s changes. When you are done, click on the red “Submit Changes” button at the bottom left corner.



Step Five: You will receive a confirmation page that look like this the one to the left. Your information will then be sent to Melvlyn Brown at the Fort Worth Housing Authority. You will also receive a confirmation email from TCHC.
